### **FAST FACTS**





Since 1998, Brown County Community Foundation has had the privilege of awarding Lilly Endowment Community Scholarships to 31 Brown County High School Graduates. This annual scholarship will pay full four-year tuition and \$900 a year for books and equipment to the Indiana public or private college of their choice. The scholarships are the result of a statewide Lilly Endowment initiative to help Indiana students reach higher levels of education. Indiana ranks among the lowest states in the percentage of residents over the age of 25 with a bachelor's degree. During the first 15 years of the program, 3,629 students have received Lilly Endowment Community Scholarships statewide. Those scholars are attending 45 different Indiana col-

## 2013 Grants



During the 2013 competitive grant cycle, and Cummins matching grant cycle the Foundation distributed \$70,509.01. Nineteen organizations received full or partial funding.

An Investment in the Community . . . The Brown County Community Foundation strives to ensure that its grantmaking meets donors' charitable interests and addresses the community's changing needs. Grants are viewed as investments in the community that should be made wisely and fairly. Effective grantmaking requires good working relationships with nonprofit agencies. Grant recipients are the Foundation's partners. Their ideas and capabilities determine the impact of grant investments. The Foundation gives priority to programs having measurable outcomes. Grantmaking fields of interest include the areas of arts and culture, education, environment, human services, public health and other charitable purposes. Grants are made only to organizations whose intent is for charitable purposes. Most grants are made to nonprofit organizations that are classified as tax-exempt Section 501(c)(3) public charities. The Foundation operates without discrimination as to age, race, faith, gender, sexual orientation, national origin, disability or financial status in the consideration of grant requests. It will award grants only to organizations operating without discrimination. Grant seekers are encouraged to contact the Foundation for specific grant guidelines and application procedures. Competitive grant requests are reviewed by the Grants Committee and presented to the Board of Trustees for approval.

Volunteering is generally considered an altruistic activity and is intended to promote goodness or improve human quality of life. There is no financial gain involved; however, those that volunteer usually feel that the activity can produce a feeling of self-worth and respect. The word volunteer was first recorded in 1630 to describe "one who offers himself for community service in a military context; a volunteer army." In the 19<sup>th</sup> century Clara Barton and her team of volunteers began providing aid to serviceman. Barton founded the American Red Cross in 1881 and began mobilizing volunteers for disaster relief operations after the Johnstown Flood in 1889.

In the 20<sup>th</sup> and 21<sup>st</sup> century The Salvation Army organized a number of volunteering programs to work with disadvantaged people. In the 21<sup>st</sup> century this tradition continued with Rotary International, Kiwanis International and Lions Club International. Volunteering has a long history of improving schools, developing countries, our environment, emergency services and corporations to name a few causes of shared concern. With the arrival of the internet one can now be a virtual volunteer.

In Brown County the tradition of volunteerism is strong and many of our community assets would not be available without the time, talent and treasure of our community of volunteers. The Brown County Community Foundation is celebrating these community members at this year's annual meeting in two ways. First, we are hosting a Volunteer Fair for local non profits in conjunction with our meeting to allow interested citizens to learn more about their mission, their volunteer opportunities and hopefully to learn the joy of volunteering. Secondly, the BCCF will be awarding grants of \$500 in the name of folks that you probably know that have been nominated by a local not for profit as their volunteer of the year. Their stories and contributions are all different but they all have some common traits; they are passionate about the cause or organization they support and they are committed to improving the quality of life of our community. We are a better community because of their volunteerism.

The Brown County Community Foundation provides grants to effective organizations and together we deliver positive community impact.

For 55 years the Brown County Historical Society has carried on its mission to collect, preserve and exhibit the history of Brown County, Indiana, for the education of students, members and the general public. Impressively, during all of this time they have operated with almost 100% volunteer energy. In 2007 the Historical Society began to relocate to an ideal site next to the Pioneer Village in the heart of Nashville. Following the sale of their headquarters since 1973, a remodeled former bowling alley, the Society started putting a foundation under its dream for a new History Center. The new Center will house the Bailey/Reeve Historical Archives, the Society Office; provide space for the monthly dinner meetings and Pioneer Women workshops. Brown County has a marrow-deep pride in its natural beauty, wildlife, its stories, musical arts, tales and lore that compose its traditions and the new Center will be a worthy meeting place to share all of this with history enthusiasts from near and afar.

The Brown County Community Foundation has awarded many grants to support the Brown County Historical Society and these grants have delivered positive impact to the community from both an educational and economic development perspective. We are proud to support their current construction effort with a Cummins Match grant for \$7500. These funds were utilized, in partnership with funds from the Nature Conservancy, to dismantle a historic log cabin located on Freeman Ridge Road and move the logs to the construction site. These logs will become the walls of the Museum Log Room with a large stone fireplace for gatherings and special events that will be named in honor of Fred and Mary Jane Lorenz. This will truly be a place where Brown County's treasures will be preserved and beautifully displayed while current history is made.
